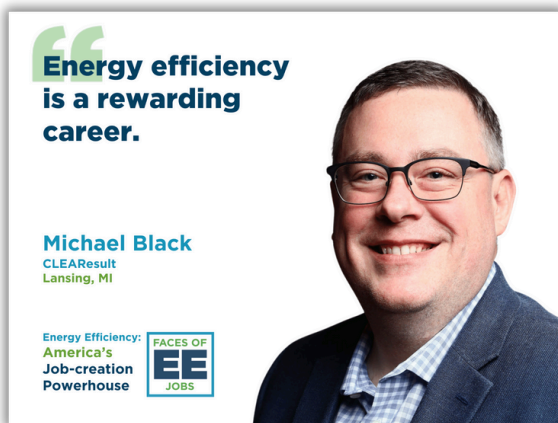

**Support for energy efficiency will save Michiganians money and boost local economies.**

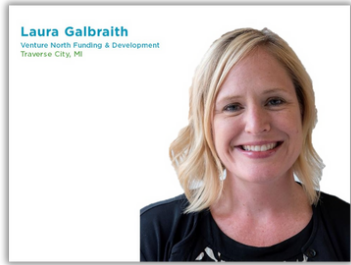
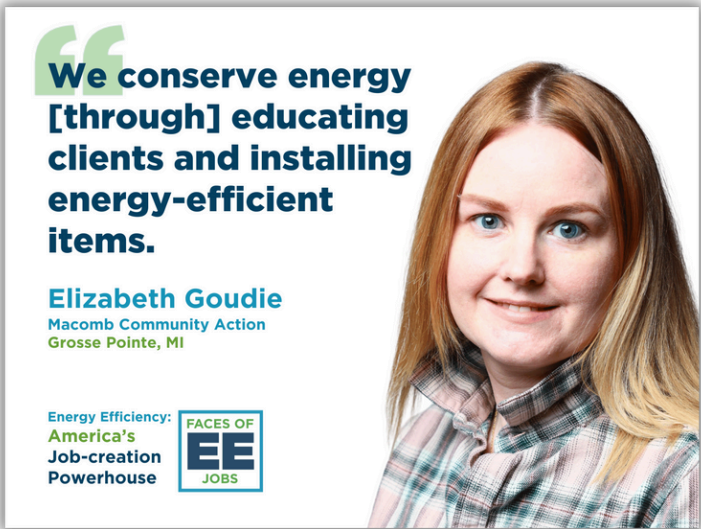
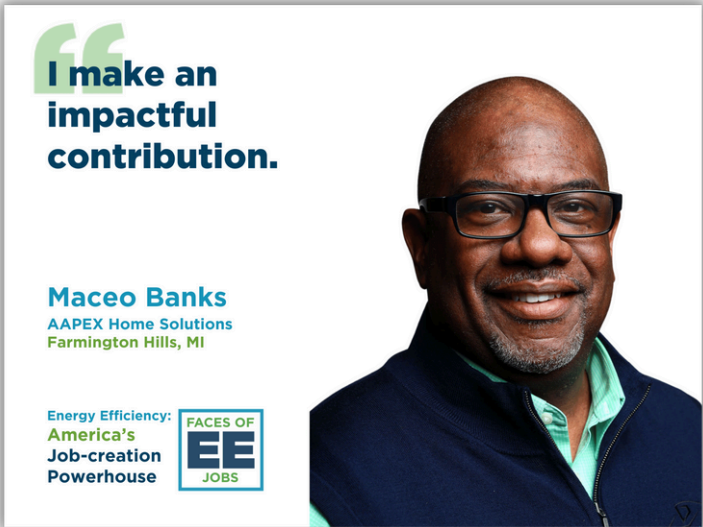
